### Obamacare Enrollment Begins By Carol

On January 1, 2014, just about everyone must have medical insurance or face a tax penalty. Everyone must be able to get coverage, no matter how sick. To meet that goal, insurance exchanges opened on October 1 to start selling policies on-line. The website for California is <a href="www.coveredca.com">www.coveredca.com</a>. California's website had 5 million on-line hits and several glitches because the demand was so high. The website is the best resource to those that need insurance. Here are some highlights of the choices:

Plans are grouped by tiers: platinum, gold, silver and bronze. The finer the metal the higher the premium and coverage. There is a way to screen by doctors to see if they are in the plan. Currently, there are twelve insurance companies that offer policies in California.

If you are on Medicare you do not have to do anything. Obamacare will not affect Medicare or the supplement (Medigap) or Medicare advantage policies. Beware of phone scams or door to door sales targeting seniors. Medicare never contacts the public directly.

Details on Medicare plans for 2014 will be published October 15<sup>th</sup> and you have until December 7<sup>th</sup> to select your coverage for the upcoming year. If you are currently on Medicare, you should have received a notice in September detailing changes to your part D and or Advantage plan. Average premiums for part D are expected to rise just one dollar per month. However, pay close attention to what you are getting for said premium. Most of the changes will be seen in co-payments, deductibles, co-insurance, and drug tiers. *Continued on pg* 2
